Matt Radford Davies is an Associate Professor in the Shakespeare and Performance graduate program at Mary Baldwin University in partnership with the American Shakespeare Center in Staunton, Virginia. Local directing credits include Tuna Does Vegas (Heritage Theatre Festival), Love's Labour's Lost (ASC), Romeo and Juliet (Starling Shakespeare), Three Sisters (MBU), *Twelfth Night* (Radford U). He has directed twenty Shakespeare productions for S&P, and will direct *Henry IV, Part 1* for Prague Shakespeare this summer. Professional regional acting credits include Othello and Twelfth Night (ASC), Shakespeare in Love and Curious Incident (Virginia Rep); Merchant of Venice and King Lear (Quill, Richmond); Antony and Cleopatra and All's Well (Virginia Shakespeare Festival); Antony and Cleopatra (Chesapeake Shakespeare); and The Tempest (JMU). He has performed the "Stanislavsky roles" in all Chekhov's major plays. Matt has won awards in both the US and UK, including Best Actor, *Merchant of Venice*, Richmond Critics Circle; Best Ensemble, Rose Rage (B. Iden Payne, Austin); Outstanding Lead Actor, Much Ado (BIP); Best Supporting Actor, Richard III (Austin Critics Circle); Best Actor, Misconceptions (Manchester Evening News); and Best Ensemble, Our Boys (London Time Out Awards). He has a Ph.D in English from The University of Texas at Austin.

Eamonn Farrell is a Virginia-based theater maker and video designer. With his Brooklyn-based theater company, Anonymous Ensemble, he has created dozens of original, media-infused shows, installations, and live webcasts in New York City and around the world. Eamonn also works frequently with Mabou Mines, Sarah Michelson, and Paul Lazar. Other design credits include: TFANA, B3 Dance (Bessie Nomination), LA Dance, The LA Phil,
