Choreographers

Sara Burtner (4th Year, Kinesiology, Dance minor) The impetus for the solo *I slept fine* arose from the tribulations with my mind when trying to fall asleep to white noise. This piece explores the weight of emotions felt when finding peace with the thoughts that keep you up at night, navigating solace versus escape from the noise of the past, present, and future.

Maria Paula Guzman (4th Year, Commerce, Dance minor) *Zēteō* means to seek in order to find in Greek, and I wanted the piece to demonstrate that there can be joy in the midst of seeking for something so earnestly.

Alyssa Kelley (3rd Year, Biology, Environmental Thought and Practice, Dance minor) *Untitled*, Hoos Got Moves Showcase 2022 (University Programs Council). In my piece, *We've Been Here Before*, I explore the tension between reality and dreams and how we might navigate between the two.

Kim Brooks Mata is a choreographer, screendance maker, and Associate Professor serving as the Artistic Director of the Dance Program at the University of Virginia where she teaches modern/contemporary, composition, screendance, and Laban/Bartenieff Movement Studies.

As a Registered Somatic Movement Educator and Certified Laban/Bartenieff Movement Analyst (CLMA), her creative work, teaching, and performance coaching all rely heavily on her background in somatics. Common themes found in her work focus on the concept of relationality (to one another, landscapes, and the spaces and places we perform with and through), the exploration of performance through live and digital compositions, and the choreography of video editing. Her screendance works have been screened as official selections in Scotland, Sweden, Italy, Finland, and across the US. Kim studied dance at The Rotterdam Dance Academy (now Codarts) in the Netherlands and holds an MFA in Modern Dance from the University of Utah. *The time it takes* explores awareness, perception, and limitations. The work develops as individual and collective paths diverge and converge, highlighting the time it takes to find support in ourselves and one another as we make our way to the next part of our journey.

Gabrielle Richardson (4th year, Global Public Health, Dance minor) In *midday sun*, *sojourn at the shore* I have continued to craft a screen dance creative process with a unique set of dancers centered in nature. Here we explored the ways the topographies of place and flow of movement through different people brings life to both in novel ways.

afloat (memory's ocean) grounded (reflection's forest) In this piece, I am exploring the intersections of significant movement that shaped my life and aspirations as a dancer and the formative experience moving through new spaces and techniques during my time here.

Katie Baer Schetlick is a dance artist and current Assistant Professor of Dance at the University of Virginia. Her work has been presented at Dixon Place, Movement Research at Judson Church, NADA Hudson, Fleet Moves Dance Festival, Museum Perron Oost (Netherlands), Lublin International Dance Theatres Festival (Poland), SESC Villa Mariana (Brazil), Cairo Downtown Contemporary Arts Festival (Egypt), Bridge Progressive Arts Initiative, Ruffin Gallery, and the Welcome Gallery. As a performing artist, Katie has worked with Yaa Samar! Dance Theatre, The Francesca Harper Project, Susan Marshall & Company, Athena Kokoronis, Carte Blanche Performance, Jennifer Hoyt Tidwell, and frequent collaborator, Zena Bibler. Together with Bibler she has facilitated workshops at The New Museum, CLASSCLASSCLASS, Electric Fish Studio, Centrum Kultury W Lublinie, NYU, and Dance Studies Association Conferences. She holds a MFA in Dance from

Hollins University and a Masters in Performance Studies from New York University. <u>Katieschetlick.com</u>

Alongside Bill Orcutt's *Music For Four Guitars*, *Dance For Four Dancers* welcomes the criff as catharsis. Here, dancers both feel and articulate interlaced vibrations, mediums in all senses.

Ruth Sherman is an Artistic Associate & Choreographer at Charlottesville Ballet. She was Miss Dance of New England 1999. She performed with Gus Giordano Jazz Dance Company and Chicago Tap Theater for four seasons. After graduating from Northwestern, Ruth returned as an Adjunct Faculty Jazz teacher. As well, she taught at Giordano School and Master classes in Hawaii, Florida, Latvia, Germany, Mexico and Bruges. In 2008 Ruth moved to Berlin, Germany where she performed with Schindowski Ballet and Sidi Larbi Eastman Company in Wagner's *Der Ring des Nibelungen* at the Deutsche Oper in Berlin, Germany and La Scala in Milan, Italy.

In 2019, Ruth was the Resident Supervisor for the Alonzo King Lines Summer Program, and in 2020 Ruth received her master's in dance pedagogy and choreography from Mills College. In addition to teaching in the Charlottesville Ballet Academy, Ruth works with the professional company and will be choreographing for the trainee program this season.

Elizabeth Culbertson graduated from the University of Virginia in December 2019 with a BA in Studio Art. She concentrated in Cinematography and Photography. She now works as a videographer in Charlottesville. When she is not working with her camera she spends time on her farm with her sheep and garden.

In her work, no object or outcome is sacred; but the ritual to get there is.
