DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Written in 1664 and revised—twice—until it was officially sanctioned for performance by Louis XIV in 1669, *Tartuffe* is as relevant now as it was waaaaay back when—for it seems that hypocrisy, and especially religious hypocrisy, never goes out of style.

As ever, Molière's great play is a fusion of styles: commedia dell'arte tempered with psychological insight, social satire, wit—as well as being a biting indictment of moral extravagance coupled with an impassioned plea for moderation in all things. That the play has withstood the test of time attests to its greatness. As does the brilliance of Richard Wilbur's translation/adaptation, capturing as it does, with economy and alacrity, a view of a culture on the cusp of the Enlightenment and a society on the brink of great cultural and social change.

It is crucial to the argument of the play to remember that at its heart the debate is about morality and ethics, examining as it does the right—and the wrong—way to live, survive and navigate in the world. There are two opposing forces at work in *Tartuffe*—one voice advocating reason, logic, kindness and decency in one's dealing with others, and the other arguing that "it's no sin to sin in confidence."

Tartuffe is also a domestic comedy, taking place in Paris in the course of one dramatic, exasperating, exhausting, dynamic day. As with most great humanistic comedies, it's about a family torn apart and reunited; about a marriage—or two—or three—thwarted and reinstated, and about the indomitability of the human spirit to endure and right itself in a time of crisis.

Welcome to our Tartuffe.
